In memory of GEORGE BRYANT

who died 5 June 1819 aged 87

It is unknown which George Bryant this is as there is no burial record for him, however, we do know that 10/6 was paid between April and June 1822 to place a head stone over his grave.¹

We only know that he was 87 when he died from the 1894 transcription of his stone.² This would make his birth date around 1732.

There are records of a George Bryant, an adult person, being baptised at Bow Meeting on 10th April 1763 by Abraham Tozer but whether this was him we may never know.³

Other records show a George Bryant of Exeter as a Joiner, carpenter, and builder. Extant apprentice records for a George Bryant of Exeter, joyner and carpenter, show him taking on a William Walter as an apprentice on 28th September 1762 and again an Isaac Chilcot on 20th August 1766.⁴

There are twelve Bryant's buried in the Dissenters graveyard; possibly all related? Further research needs to be undertaken before we can say who this George Bryant was and what his relationship to the other Bryant's was if any.
