Elizabeth TAPRELL China TAPRELL Elizabeth TAPRELL

This headstone commemorates China Taprell, his wife Elizabeth and their infant daughter, also called Elizabeth, who died at the age of two.

China Taprell was baptised in Bere Ferrers near Plymouth on 20th May 1770 and was the son of Charles and Catherine Taperell.¹ (Note: the surname has many variants in the spelling). By his mid-twenties he had moved to Exeter along with his elder brother Charles; they both lived in the Cathedral Close and worked as joiners. (See **Taperell** biography).

China married Elizabeth Cann on 11th January 1795 at St Mary Arches church in Exeter.² They had two daughters; Mary, who was baptised on 1st November 1795 at St Mary Major³ and Elizabeth, who was born on 2nd February 1800 and baptised at the Castle Street Independent Chapel, Exeter on 22nd March 1801.⁴

According to the inscription on the headstone the infant Elizabeth died on 27th January 1804 aged 2 years. However there is a discrepancy here with her date of birth in February 1800. The account book for the Dissenters' Graveyard shows a payment of 8 shillings from Tapperell for breaking the ground for the burial of his child on 1st February 1802.⁵ It is probable therefore that she died on 27th January 1802 and that the headstone, which was not erected until 1817, is incorrect.

China died in 1828 and was buried on 21st November. In the burial register he was described as a joiner living at "College in the Close".⁶ The college probably refers to the site of the old College of the Vicars Choral which by the 19th Century were let out as individual lodgings.

Elizabeth, China's wife, who is also on this memorial, was buried on 27th April 1835, aged 69, and was still living in The Close at the time of her death⁷.

Their elder daughter Mary Taprell never married, and was shown in the censuses from 1841 to 1871 as living alone in The (Cathedral) Close, working as a corset maker.⁸ She died in 1872, aged 78.⁹
